

How to find a Monologue for Auditions

A simple google search will reveal a vast selection of monologues for auditions. Many websites offer tips on how to pick the perfect monologue. Here are a few quick ones:

- Find a monologue that fits you and your experiences. Find a character or situation that you can relate to.
- Pick a monologue that is age-appropriate. If you're in your 10, don't choose a monologue for a young adult!
- Choose a monologue that is suitable for the role you want. Are you auditioning for a comedy? Pick a comedic monologue! Want to get a role in a drama? Pick a dramatic one.
- Practice! Practice! You should practice every day for at LEAST a week. You can't pull together a good monologue in one day.
- Memorize the words for your performance

IMPORTANT PARENTAL WARNING: not all monologues on the websites listed below are appropriate for LTA students or for "The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe." Parents should read monologues in advance before recommending them to their students.
