Concurrent Enrollment Guidelines

In regards to Concurrent Enrollment, we will be offering it through Pikes Peak Community College, however there are guidelines that are required to participate with that option.

- Have a minimum 3.5 overall GPA at LTA
- Take and pass the Accuplacer exam at Pikes Peak, you would need to set this exam up as it is appointment based <https://www.ppcc.edu/admissions/testing-center/placement-testing/index.php>
- The first exam is free if your student needs to retake it for any reason the cost then falls on the student for the additional exams.
- Pass all pre-requisite courses for college and those at LTA
- Teacher and College Career Advisor will sign off prior to starting
- If student has more than 3 detentions or 1 ISS/OSS will be put on probation for the following semester and not be allowed to participate in Concurrent Enrollment that following semester
- Submit signed parent permission letter
- Must be on track to graduate at LTA (not missing any needed credits. We require 27 credits for graduation and only 4 of those are electives)
- Meet a deadline to apply (the college sets these dates but generally fall/spring semester (the deadline for fall is Aug 28th)
- Parents are responsible for transportation to and from college
- If a student has a low grade during their concurrent enrollment class, it WILL affect their GPA at LTA. If the student fails, that student will be charged the reimbursement fee for that particular college course. LTA still holds the students to their grade precepts that are listed in the school policy handbook to be considered passing/failing even if the college percent is different.

- Student has attended all ICAPs
- Has signed financial agreement form
